OUTCOME OF LOCALIZING SDG IN VIEW



Recall that on 18 October 2017, we selected 50 participants as SDGs champions for an awareness-raising workshop at the Government Girls Secondary School, which is located in Kaduna, Nigeria. The training was aimed at bringing closer, localizing, stepping down and spreading the message of the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) to the root beneficiaries at the grassroots level, and to deliver the training by young people, to young people. As a result of the workshop, we identified 17 local SDGs champions who would continue to teach about the SDGs after the workshop, and in and out of the school, so that the conversation can continue.

During the workshop, participants asked us the correlation of SDG 6 to dysfunctional pit toilet in the school for over 2,000 school girls. That question was a challenge to us. So after the program, we took pictures and recorded their complaint via video and then forwarded a petition with pictures and videos on their behalf to the Kaduna State Government as owners of the school. That paid off.
